For MSE's Govt. of India provision shall be considered while evaluating the offer (Complete details attached in Annexure III)

#### GENERAL RULES AND INSTRUCTIONS TO THE INTENDING APPLICANTS:

- 1. Generally, the routine works of the Bank are awarded/procurements are made on calling competitive tenders/quotations from the empanelled contractors/suppliers and in case of emergent works/ works of small magnitude, the Bank may opt to award the work/procure supply from any of the empanelled agencies, depending on the exigencies of the work on nomination basis and also has the right for open tendering process for any particular work, depending on the nature & magnitude of the work.
- 2. The details of the applicants and their experience shall be furnished in the prescribed "Application Format" only. Wherever required and if the space provided is not sufficient, particulars can be furnished in Annexures but such details shall be clearly mentioned in the respective columns of the Application Format. Applicant shall enclose latest copies of brochures and technical documentation giving additional information about the applicant. Each page of the document shall be duly signed by the Applicant or their authorized representative.
- 3. The Contractors, who intend to apply for more than one category, have to apply for each category using separate application forms along with separate Demand Draft and submit in independent covers superscribing in the envelope the category of work applied for. Multiple application in single cover is summarily rejected.
- 4. No costs incurred by the applicant in applying, in providing necessary clarifications or attending discussions, conferences or site visits will be reimbursed by the Bank.
- 5. Documentary proof for the work orders and completion certificates and or such other documents shall be submitted along with the application. Incomplete applications or applications without proper proof for establishing their credentials will be liable for rejection and no correspondence will be entertained in this regard.
- 6. The authorised person of the firm/ company shall sign in all the pages of the application with seal of the company/firm.
- 7. The empanelment will be made for a specific category depending on the credentials submitted. However, the applicant empanelled in higher category shall be eligible for works in the lower category.
- 8. The evaluation will be based on the experience, reputation, empanelment with other Banks, PSUs, Govt institutions, manpower & logistical support of the applicant, their financial capabilities, quality consciousness, etc and if found necessary may also include inspecting the works undertaken by them for which, necessary co-ordination shall be made by them. Based on the details furnished and inspection of works, eligibility criteria, the applicants will be empanelled. Decision of the Bank regarding selection / rejection for empanelment will be final and binding and no further correspondence will be entertained. The empanelled contractors will only be informed by post/email.
- 9. If, information and details furnished by applicants are found to be false at any time in future or any information withheld, which comes to the notice of the Bank at a later date, the empanelment of such applicant will be cancelled immediately.
- 10. Applications received after the due date and time is liable for rejection.
- 11. The Applicants having their office / Sales & Service centre in the geographical jurisdiction of ANDHRA PRADESH Circle (As Mentioned Above) will only be preferred. The empanelment shall be valid for a period of three years from the date of intimation letter to the shortlisted contractors.



- 12. The present empanelment is mainly for works for value upto the limits mentioned in respective categories. In case of any high value works, Bank may undertake the works by project specific prequalification exercise.
- 13. The applicant should be a profit making firm for the last 3 years as on 31.03.2024.
- 14. Canara Bank reserves its right to reject any / or all the applications without assigning any reasons whatsoever.
- 15. Firms should submit a undertaking (On their Letter Head) that they have not been "Blacklisted" by any of the Govt Authority / PSUs / PSBs duly signed by authorized signatory with company seal.
- 16. Empanelment provides an opportunity to firms to participate in the tender process invited from time to time for various routine works. Empanelment does not provide a guarantee for getting any work assigned. The Applicant should be in touch with the GA section after the empanelment process.
- I) SCOPE, COST WISE SUB-CLASSIFICATION AND ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR CONTRACTORS, SUPPLIERS

Empanelment of Contractors/suppliers is sought for the following categories of works under various cost limits. The contractors/suppliers empanelled under lower cost limit will not be eligible to quote for the works costing more than the limit.

However, the contractors/suppliers empanelled under higher class can participate even for works/ supply in lower cost limits.

# Eligibility:

The applicant should have the following minimum eligibility criteria:

i. The applicant should have undertaken works in Government Departments/ Public Sector Undertaking/ Central Autonomous Bodies/ State Autonomous Bodies/ Financial Institutions during last 3 years prior to 31.03.2024:

One work/project costing 80% of the class limit or Two works/projects costing 50% of the class limit or Three works/projects costing 40% of the class limit

- ii. The applicant should be an assessee of Income Tax and must possess GST Registration. Kindly submit copy of the income tax PAN, GST certificate with valid registration number.
- iii. The applicant shall have the average annual financial turnover of atleast 30% the value of the class limit in the respective category during last 3 years ending with 31.03.2024.
- iv. Submit Solvency Certificate from Nationalized /scheduled banks issued within one year for an amount equal to cost limit in the respective field (only for Class A, B AND C). It must be addressed to our bank



# Requirements of Architect:

The proprietor should have a graduate/post graduate degree in architecture. Registered with the council of Architecture/Members of the Indian Institute of Architecture and should have experience in planning, designing and supervising Civil Engineering, Interior Architecture and should have experience in planning, designing and supervising civil engineering, Interior works for the banks, Financial Institution and for software companies.

Based on the assessment of details furnished like works undertaken, technical & financial capabilities, selection will be made. From such panel, competitive offers/tenders will be called for specific works.

1. INTERIOR FURNISHING WORKS: The scope of work of Contractors for Interior works mainly original works, alterations and renovations involving erection of partitions work both wood & aluminium, counters, paneling, false ceiling, cavity flooring, storage units, furniture and fabricated workstations and other allied works for furnishing of our bank branches.

The Class A, B, C contractors shall have full-fledged work shop for preparing the furnishing/ furniture items.

2. ELECTRICAL CONTRACTORS: The scope of work for Electrical Contractors is to undertake HT as well as LT works, panel board for LT applications, will be mainly used for internal and external electrification, associated cabling, copper plate earthing, wiring for air-conditioners, UPS, liasoning with State Electricity Boards or their allied bodies for obtention of additional power, breakdown repair, interior wiring for computerized office environment and other allied works.

The electrical works also involves domestic electrical works attending to LT side, State Electricity Boards or their allied bodies in case of meter burn outs etc. attending to repairs of electrical appliances like fans, geysers, pumps & motors, switch boards, rewiring and cabling works. Exposure to repairs of other appliances like fridge, mixies, washing machines etc. will be added advantage.

Electrical contractors shall have necessary permits / license from Electrical Inspectorate and familiar with rules & regulations of the electricity board.

- 3. Civil Engineering works The broad scope of work of Civil Contractors is to undertake new constructions, redevelopment of existing properties, periodical repairs & renovations, painting, plumbing & sanitary, demolition works, structural steel fabrication, wood work (doors and windows only) waterproofing works of terrace, lift well, toilets etc. and other allied works for residences and offices of the Bank.
- 4. Architect Works: The broad scope of Architect involves preparation of layouts for branches/offices. Supervision of Strong Room Construction and submitting certificate. Conducting visits while ongoing of works for ensuring quality and final certificate for verification of quantities and recommending for releasing to contractors.

If other things being Equal, the professionally qualified contractors and the contractors who have undertaken the works for Govt organizations will be preferred.

All class of contractors must be Income Tax Assessee. The contractors, otherwise eligible but not Income tax assesses, will not be considered for empanelment.

All contractors should have registered for GST. If otherwise eligible but not registered for GST will not be considered for empanelment.

# ANNEXURE III PURCHASE PREFERENCE

Purchase Preference to Micro and Small Enterprises (MSEs) and Startups and Purchase Preference linked with Local Content (PP-LC) shall be applicable subject to full compliance of other terms and conditions of the RFP and Contract. Following are the conditions applicable as per the Government of India Guidelines on Purchase Preference.

### 1. Micro & Small Enterprises [MSEs]:

Procurement through MSEs (Micro & Small Enterprises) will be done as per the Policy guidelines issued by the Ministry of Micro, Small & Medium Enterprises vide Gazette notification no. D.L.-33004/99 dated 23.03.2012 and as amended from time to time.

Following are the conditions applicable as per the Government of India Guidelines

- 1.1.MSEs should provide proof of their being registered as MSE (indicating the Terminal Validity Date of their Registration) for the item under Tender/ RFP along with their offer, with any agency mentioned in the Notification, including:
- 1.1.1.District Industries Centres or
- 1.1.2.Khadi Village Industries Commission or
- 1.1.3.Khadi & Village Industries Board or
- 1.1.4. Coir Board or National Small Industries Corporation or
- 1.1.5.Directorate of Handicrafts & Handloom or
- 1.1.6. Any other body specified by the Ministry of Micro, Small & Medium Enterprises.
- 1.1.7. For ease of registration of Micro and Small Enterprises (MSMEs), Ministry of MSE has started Udyog Aadhaar Memorandum which is an online registration system (free of cost) w.e.f. 18th September, 2015 and all Micro & Small Enterprises (MSEs) who are having Udyog Aadhaar Memorandum should also be provided all the benefits available for MSEs under the Public Procurement Policy for Micro and Small Enterprises (MSEs), Order 2012.
- 1.2. MSEs participating in tenders, quoting price within price band of L1+15% shall also be allowed to supply a portion of requirement by bringing down their price to L1 in a situation where L1 price is from someone other than MSE & such MSE shall be allowed to supply at least 20% of total tendered value. In case there are more than one MSEs within such price band and agree to bring down their price to L1, the 20% quantity is to be distributed proportionately among these Bidders.
- 1.3. MSEs are exempted from paying Application fee/cost & EMD, subject to furnishing of Valid certificate for claiming Exemption.
- 1.4. The Eligible MSEs who intend to match the L1 Price (ultimately decided by the Bank) shall indicate the willingness to match the L1 Price within 6 working days from the date of communication from the Bank to avail the purchase preference.
- 1.5.Bidder has to submit as self-declaration accepting that if they are awarded the contract and they fail to sign the contract, or to submit a performance security before the deadline defined in the RFP, they will be suspended for the period of three years from being eligible to submit Bids for contracts with Canara Bank as per Form PP-B.
- 1.6.The aforesaid Policy is meant for procurement of only goods produced and Services rendered by MSEs and not for any trading activities by them. An MSE unit will not get any Purchase Preference over any other MSE Unit.
- 1.7.The details are available on web site dcmsme.gov.in. Interested vendors are requested to go through the same for details.

# 2. Startup:

2.1.Applicable for Indian Bidders only as defined in gazette notification no. D.L-33004/99 dated 11.04.2018 of Ministry of Commerce and Industry and as amended from time to time.



- 2.2.As mentioned in Section-II of O.M. No.F.20/2/2014-PPD(Pt.) dated 20.09.2016 of Procurement Policy Division, Department of Expenditure, Ministry of Finance on Prior turnover and prior experience, relaxations may be applicable for all Startups [whether Micro & Small Enterprises (MSEs) or otherwise] subject to meeting of the quality and technical specifications specified in tender document.
- 2.3. Further, the Startups are also exempted from submission of Tender Fee and EMDs.
- 2.4.For availing the relaxations, bidder is required to submit requisite certificate towards Startup enterprise registration issued by Department of Industrial Policy and Promotion, Ministry of Commerce and the certificate should be certified by the Chartered Accountant (not being an employee or a Director or not having any interest in the bidder"s company/firm) and notary public with legible stamp.
- 2.5.Bidder has to submit as self-declaration accepting that if they are awarded the contract and they fail to sign the contract, or to submit a performance security before the deadline defined in the RFP, they will be suspended for the period of three years from being eligible to submit Bids for contracts with Canara Bank as per Form PP-B.
- 2. Procurement through Local Suppliers (Make in India):
  - Department of Industrial Policy and Promotion under Ministry of Commerce and Industry vide letter no. P-45021/2/2017-PP (BE-II) dated 28.05.2018 has notified revised guidelines to be followed to promote manufacturing and production of goods and services in India under "Make in India" initiative.
  - 3.1. "Local Supplier" means a supplier or service provider whose product or service offered for procurement meets the minimum local content as prescribed under the aforesaid order or by the competent Ministries/Departments in pursuance of the aforesaid order.
  - 3.2. The minimum local content shall be 50% in general (unless otherwise prescribed by the Nodal Ministry) and the margin of purchase preference shall be 20%.
  - 3.3.For award of contract, the following clauses shall be applicable in addition to other provisions in the bidding document in this regard:
  - 3.3.1 In procurement of goods, services or works in respect of which the Nodal Ministry has communicated that there is sufficient local capacity and local competition, and where the estimated value of procurement is Rs. 50 lakhs or only local suppliers shall be eligible. If the estimated value of procurement of goods or services or works is more than Rs. 50 lakhs, the provisions of sub-paragraph 3.3.2 or 3.3.3, as the case may be, shall apply;
  - 3.3.2.In the procurements of goods or works which are not covered by paragraph 3.3.1 and which are divisible in nature, the following procedure shall be followed:
  - 3.3.2.1. Among all qualified bids, the lowest bid will be termed as L1. If L1 is from a local supplier, the contract for full quantity will be awarded to L1.
  - 3.3.2.2. If L1 bid is not from a local supplier, 50% of the order quantity shall be awarded to L1. Thereafter, the lowest bidder among the local suppliers, will be invited to match the L1 price for the remaining 50% quantity subject to the local supplier"s quoted price falling within the margin of purchase preference, and contract for that quantity shall be awarded to such local supplier subject to matching the L1 price. In case such lowest eligible local supplier fails to match the L1 price or accepts less than the offered quantity, the next higher local supplier within the margin of purchase preference shall be invited to match the L1 price for remaining quantity and so on, and contract shall be awarded accordingly. In case, some quantity is still left uncovered on local suppliers, then such balance quantity may also be ordered on the L1 bidder.



- 3.3.3.In procurement of goods or works not covered by sub-paragraph 3.3.1 and which are not divisible, and in procurement of services where the bid is evaluated on price alone, the following procedure shall be followed:
- 3.3.3.1. Among all qualified bids, the lowest bid will be termed as L1. If L1 is from a local supplier, the contract will be awarded to L1.
- 3.3.3.2. If L1 bid is not from a local supplier, the lowest bidder among the local suppliers, will be invited to match L1 price subject to local supplier"s quoted price falling within the margin of purchase preference, and the contract shall be awarded to such local supplier subject to matching L1 price.
- 3.3.3.3. In case such lowest eligible local supplier fails to match the L1 price, the local supplier with the next higher bid within the margin of purchase preference shall be invited to match the L1 price and so on and contract shall be awarded accordingly. In case none of the local suppliers within the margin of purchase preference matches the L1 price, then the contract may be awarded to the L1 bidder.
- 3.4.Purchase preference for domestic manufacturer/local supplier, methodology of its implementation, value addition to be achieved by domestic manufacturers, selfcertification, compliance, monitoring and other terms & conditions shall be as per the aforesaid Guidelines/Notifications. The Guidelines may be treated as an integral part of the tender documents.
- 3.5. The preference to "Public Procurement (Preference to Make in India) Order 2017" shall be subject to meeting technical specifications and full compliance of other terms and conditions of the RFP and Contract.
- 3.6. The Bidder quoting value upto Rs. 10 Crores shall be required to provide selfcertification (as per Form PP-C) along with the bid that the item offered meets the minimum local content in terms of para 9(a) of the Public Procurement (Preference to Make in India) Order 2017. Bidder shall also submit the list of items / services to be procured from Indian manufacturers / service providers. Bidder has to provide the value & percentage of the local content in price bids.
- 3.7.If Bidder is quoting more than Rs. 10 Crores in their Commercial Proposal, then Bidder has to submit a certificate (as per Form PP-D) from statutory auditor of the company (in case bidder is a company) or from a practicing Cost Accountant or practicing Charted Accountant (in case bidder is not a company) along with his bid in terms of para 9(a) of the Public Procurement (Preference to Make in India) Order 2017. Bidder has to provide the value & percentage of the local content in price bids.
- 3.8.False declarations will be in breach of the Code of Integrity under Rule 175(1)(i)(h) of the General Financial Rules issued by the Ministry of Finance for which a bidder or its successors can be debarred for up to two years as per Rule (iii) of the General Financial Rules along with such other actions as may be permissible under law.
- 3.9.All the relevant documents/information regarding claim for preferential treatment under this policy must be submitted along with offer by the tenderers. Post tender submission of these information/documents shall not be considered. Further firms seeking these considerations shall be completely responsible for the truthfulness and authenticity of their claim for these benefits.
- 3.10. Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY):

In furtherance of the Public Procurement (Preference to Make in India) Order 2017 notified vide reference cited above, Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology, Government of India

has notified ten (10) electronic products vide reference F.No.33(1)/2017-IPHW dated 14.09.2017.

- 3.10.1. Domestic Manufacturers are required to indicate the domestic value addition/Local Content in terms of Bill of Material (BoM) for the quoted products, in terms of aforesaid guidelines, in their bid. Bidders, claiming to bid in the status of domestic manufacturer/local supplier on behalf of domestic manufacturer are also required to give an undertaking in the format as given in Meity Form-1.
- 3.11. Department of Telecommunications (DoT): In furtherance of the Public Procurement (Preference to Make in India) Order 2017, Department of Telecommunications, Ministry of Communications, Government of India has notified Thirty-Six (36) Telecom Products, Services and Works vide reference No. 18-10/2017-IP dated 29.08.2018.
- 3.11.1. Domestic Manufacturers are required to indicate the domestic value addition/Local Content in terms of Bill of Material (BoM) for the quoted products, in terms of aforesaid guidelines, in their bid. Bidders, claiming to bid in the status of domestic manufacturer/local supplier on behalf of domestic manufacturer are also required to give an undertaking in the format as given in DoT Form-1.
- 3.12. Canara Bank shall also have the authority to audit as well as witness production processes to certify the achievement of the requisite local content and/or to obtain complete back up calculation.
- 4.In case a bidder is eligible to seek benefit under Purchase PP-LC policy as well as PPP for MSE 2012, then the bidder should categorically seek benefits against only one of the two policies i.e. either PP-LC and MSE policy in Form PP-A. The option once exercised cannot be modified subsequently.
- 5. Purchase preference benefits shall be extended to the bidder based on the declared option subject to the bidder meeting the requirements contained in that purchase preference policy.
- 6.In case a MSEs bidder opts for purchase preference based on PP-LC, he shall not be entitled to claim purchase preference benefit available to MSE Bidders under PPP-2012. However, the exemptions from furnishing Bidding Document fee and Bid security/EMD shall continue to be available to MSE Bidders
- 7. For price matching opportunities and distribution of quantities among bidders (bidder"s option to avail any one out of two applicable purchase preference policies, i.e., PP-LC2017 or PPP-2012 will be considered), the precedence shall be in the following order:
- 7.1 Public Procurement Policy for MSE 2012
- 7.2 Purchase Preference linked with Local Content (PP-LC).
